

Hertfordshire Volleyball Association

Competition Rules (Updated 2019)

A. INTRODUCTION

1. This programme requires your full co-operation and goodwill.
2. The HVA will be firm in its dealings with offenders of the rules.
3. Make sure you read the rules. Failure to do so may result in fines/disciplinary action as ignorance is no defence.
4. Clubs are responsible for the conduct of their members at all HVA competitions. Club members are expected to behave both on and off court in an exemplary manner that promotes the spirit of the game of volleyball.

B. REGISTRATION and AFFILIATION

1. All clubs must be affiliated to the England Volleyball Association and provide their affiliation number to the Competitions Secretary before their first match is played. See K6.
2. All clubs, teams and players must be registered with the HVA.
3. League and KO Cup entry fees are to be paid to the treasurer by the 31st of December or within 21 days of receipt of the invoice, whichever is the latest. See K7.

C. CLUBS, TEAMS and PLAYERS

1. Players are only allowed to play for the club with which they are registered, in any competition organised by the HVA.
2. Players may transfer from one club to another once per season. The transfer request should be made to the Competitions Secretary in writing before the end of January.
3. Clubs must confirm the teams and the competitions they wish to enter to the HVA Competitions Secretary before 30th September.
4. Clubs can add players to their club roster via the website directly, or by request in writing to the Competitions Secretary, at any time during the season.

5. Team Player Restrictions

5.1 Every club player registered can be assigned to a club team when they are added to the club's roster. When an unassigned player plays their first league match, they are immediately assigned to that team. Players cannot change their team assignment during the season (exceptions will be considered by the committee if they receive a request in writing).

5.2. During any league match, at least four players listed as assigned to that team must be recorded as present on the court. For the avoidance of doubt, this means that club players can play up, across or down in other club teams any number of times during the season regardless of which team they are assigned to.

5.3 If one of the core players of a team is injured during a match and cannot be legally substituted by another core league player, one of the other players may be used as long as the reason is clearly recorded on the scoresheet.

5.4 Appendix A gives more information on this rule, special rules to cover libero players (who are never recorded as "present on court") and a worked example.

6. Only one player from the NVL Super 8 / SVA Division 1 can be on the score sheet for any team in the HVA. All NVL Super 8 / SVA Division 1 players must be identified on the team sheet.

7. Men/Women Players

7.1. Men cannot play for women's team in any competition.

7.2. Women may play for men's teams in the league competition, but the team player restriction rules still apply.

7.3. Women who play for a club that does not have a women's team in the Hertfordshire league competition may play in a women's team at a different club and is registered with that club as usual, effectively being registered at two clubs. It must be made clear to the Competitions Secretary, which club is the primary club as the player is not eligible to play in men's matches at their secondary club.

8. Junior Players

8.1. Any player, male or female, under the age of 16 on 1st September of the current season is considered a "Junior" player.

8.2. A Junior player registered with a club, may play in any of the club's teams, but the team player restriction rules still apply.

9. All players registered with a club are eligible to play in the Mixed Division. Each team shall have a minimum of three ladies or juniors on court at all times. The team player restriction rules do not apply for this division.

10. A player is deemed to have played if they are included on the scoresheet.

11. Any breaches of these rules mean the team has fielded an ineligible player and therefore concedes the set in which that occurred. See section E12. See K2.

D. MATCH ARRANGEMENT

1. Matches are to be played on a Home and Away basis.
2. The first named team on the match schedule is the home team.
3. Matches are played on the date and time noted in the published fixtures list. If either team does not show up for a published fixture, they forfeit the match.
4. The home team is responsible for:
 - a) All match arrangements
 - b) Sending directions
 - c) Appointing and informing match officials in writing of match details.
 - d) Sending match information to the opposing team, in writing at least 21 days before the match date.
 - e) Informing the Competitions Secretary of changes to the fixture date and/or time at least 14 days in advance of the match, or if that is not possible because the new date is less than 14 days away, then as soon as possible and at least one day before the match is played. See D7.
5. If, after 14 days before the published date and time, either team has been unable to confirm a fixture and, if the home team is the complainant, rule D5e was adhered to by the home team and despite best attempts to seek confirmation from at least two different published club/team contacts by email/phone/text, the non-responsive team forfeits the match. See K4.
6. The away team is responsible for confirming match information, in writing at least 14 days before the scheduled match date.
7. All leagues fixtures must be completed 10 days before the KO Cup final. Any match not completed before that deadline will be declared null and void.
8. Re-arranging matches.
 - 8.1 Either team can contact their opposition and request a change to the date and/or time of a published fixture. This request must be made at least 14 days before the published date, otherwise the opposition may refuse the request and the fixture goes ahead as published or is forfeited.
 - 8.2 The team wishing to re-arrange the match should make the effort to suggest some alternative dates and times when they make their request. Please look at the opposing team and club's existing fixtures before suggesting alternatives.
 - 8.3 A re-arranged match to be played within the next 14 days is deemed to have been confirmed and agreed by both teams.
 - 8.4 If a fixture is not completed by the end of the season (D5) and the date had been changed, the team who initiated the most changes for that fixture forfeits the match. If both teams requested date changes an equal number of times, the match is declared null and void.
 - 8.5 Special consideration is given when a request is received to change a league fixture to schedule a cup match, even if that cup match is against a third club. Cup matches must be played by a specific date and should be given priority. Clubs should try to accommodate cup matches and the rules in this section are relaxed.

9. Any forfeited match is lost 3-0 with a score of 25-0 for each set awarded to the opposition.

E. MATCHES OFFICIATION

1. All matches are to be played as per FIVB "Rules of the Game".
2. All HVA matches are to be played in sports halls, the size of which will be in accordance with EVA rules.
3. If local conditions require rule changes, this must be declared on the league entry form. HVA approval for such changes is required.
4. All shirts to be numbered.
5. The home team is to supply the match ball.
6. Net aerals are compulsory for all matches.
7. There must be a minimum of two hours available for play.
8. Players not recorded on the score sheet at the start of the match may not take part. Players recorded on the score sheet, but who arrive late, may not play in the set in progress, but may play in subsequent set(s).
9. At least 15 minutes warm-up time should be allowed after the confirmed start time. Note: A match can begin as soon as all teams are ready and warm up is complete. An early start is encouraged for time restricted venues (see below).
10. Any team not ready to begin play 30 minutes after the published fixture time concedes the first set. Subsequent sets are conceded every 15 minutes, until an hour after the published fixture time when the match is conceded. As soon as the late team is ready to begin, play continues as normal. If this is a time restricted venue (see below) and the match runs out of time, the late team concedes any remaining set points and remaining sets to concede the match. See K2.

11. Time Restricted Venues

11.1 If a venue is restricted by time, this must be communicated by the home team captain to the first referee and the opposition captain before the start of the match. They must agree under what situation the match will end, e.g. at a specific time or "when the caretaker arrives".

11.2 The referee should end the match, once the current set point is complete, based on the agreement made under section 11.1.

12 Result of an Incomplete Match

12.1 An incomplete match would be awarded in favour of the team with the most sets won (unless the rules at D10 apply because the match did not start on time).

12.2. For this purpose, an incomplete set is counted as a win for the team with a lead of 2 or more points, otherwise a tie. If set scores are tied, the winner is the team with a "points total" of at least two more than their opponent's.

12.3. If teams are still tied, the match is considered a draw and the two teams each get 1 league point for drawing the match.

12.4 If a time restriction is not clearly communicated as per E11.1 or there is otherwise insufficient time to complete the match, then the home team concedes all remaining set points and sets to concede the match (unless the rules at D10 apply because the match did not start on time). See K2.

F. OFFICIALS

1. The home team must appoint match officials and a competent scorer, as detailed below. It is preferred but not mandatory to use a neutral first referee for league matches. The officials for the CUP finals are provided by the HVA. See K1.

2. In the event of the non-appearance of an official, the captains of the two teams concerned shall agree to the appointment of an available official. This must be recorded on the score sheet.

3. All matches are to be recorded on official EVA score sheets. See K3a.

4. The score sheet should be marked clearly with the type of match, including division and the correct match number as per the published fixture list.

5. The home team is responsible for entering the results on the HVA website as soon as possible after each match: entering player rosters, match results and uploading a legible copy of the full scoresheet as completely as possible. The home team may request in writing that the Competitions Secretary undertakes this on their behalf, but they must still provide a legible copy of the full scoresheet, which must always be uploaded to the website for fixtures transparency. Note that the away team is also able to perform this function, although they do not have ultimate responsibility for doing so. See K3b.

6. All scoresheets must be presented at least 3 days before the KO Cup Final, else the home team forfeits the match. See K3c.

G. LEAGUE

1. League points will be awarded as follows:

- 1 point for playing the match, plus
- 1 point for every set won or half a point for a tied set, plus
- 2 points for winning the match (or 1 point to each team for drawing the match).

Where a team loses a match as a result of a forfeit, no points will be awarded to the team. However, the opposition still receives a league point as if they had played the match.

2. If two or more teams tie on league points, their league position will be decided on:

- Most matches won then
- Least matches lost then
- Most sets for then

- Least sets against then
- The set result of the matches played between the teams in the league then
- largest set point difference (set points for, minus set points against)

3. Generally, promotion and relegation is on the basis of 2 up, 2 down for divisions 1 and 2 although in practice an assessment is made at the beginning of each new season. Women's/Mixed divisions - there will be no automatic promotion. Any team from these divisions may apply to enter Division 2. The HVA executive will consider their application.

4. Teams who cancel or forfeit more than 50% of their matches, have all their matches declared null and void at the end of the season. All league points earned in these fixtures are cancelled before the end of season league table is finalised.

5. MVP (Most Valuable Player)

5.1. After each match, the captain must nominate a "Most Valuable Player" (MVP) from their opponent's team.

5.2. The nomination for each team is indicated either by a star marked next to the player's name or in the remarks section of the scoresheet.

5.3. The nomination should be made in good faith and in the spirit of the game. The first referee can override either decision at the offended team's captain's request. If the first referee feels the nomination to be unfounded, they may freely and with no input or pressure from the offended team, decide upon an alternative MVP.

5.4 The first referee has the responsibility for ensuring MVPs are marked correctly and clearly on the scoresheet. They cannot be added or amended after the event.

5.5 The HVA may make an award to the most nominated MVP in each league at the end of the season.

H. DISPUTES

1. The HVA executive will adjudicate all disputes and their decision is final.

2. Disputants must submit the request for a hearing in writing to the Chairman.

3. All parties in the dispute will be asked for a written statement and may be required to attend the executive meeting considering their dispute.

I. KO CUP

1. All rules A – H apply except that:

1.1. No male players, regardless of age, will be allowed to play in the Women's KO Cup competition

1.2. No female players, regardless of age, will be allowed to play in the Men's KO Cup competition.

2. All KO Cup players must have been registered with the club before 1st March to be eligible to play for that club in that season's KO Cup.

3. Players already having played for a team in the KO Cup may not (even if transferred) play for another team in the KO Cup of that season.

4. The KO Cup competition is only open to those clubs who play in one of the HVA leagues.

5. All HVA KO Cup matches are to be played in sports halls as per HVA Division 1 regulations.

6. Officials for all KO Cup matches must be neutral and qualified and shall be organised by the home side, as noted in the cup draw. Opposing teams will share the cost of referees.

7. Two teams from the same club in the Cup play as separate teams. These can be different to the teams registered in the league.

7.1. All players from each team must be registered for this purpose.

8. For the KO Cup finals, each team must supply two line judges and a scorer to officiate at the other match.

9. For KO Cup matches, opposing teams will share the cost of the hall hire.

J. GOODWILL DEPOSIT

1. All clubs will make a deposit of £30, from which any HVA fines are taken

2. The deposit is carried over between seasons. It must be made back up to the full agreed amount at the start of each season.

3. This deposit (or any season top-up) will be invoiced separately from the club registration fees as it must be paid before any match is played.

4. A club can withdraw its current deposit balance at any time. This request must be made in writing to the Treasurer.

5. If a club's deposit is reduced to a zero or negative balance, the club is deemed to be in breach of not paying their Goodwill Deposit and the deposit must be made back up to its full amount before the breach is considered resolved. **See K12.**

6. Any HVA executive member can issue fine with no need to notify the club in advance of their intention to do so.

7. The Treasurer will maintain the current balance of each club's Goodwill Deposit.

7.1. The Treasurer will notify the club in writing of any fine and of their balance after the fine is applied.

7.2. The Treasurer will report on each club's current deposit balance as part of their report at each committee meeting.

8. Any fine can be disputed by the affected club. The fine remains imposed until the dispute is upheld by the committee.

Appendix A: Team Player Restrictions

This Appendix explains the team player restriction rules defined in section C5, which were introduced for the 2018/19 season. It does not replace or override those rules but aims to explain why they have been introduced and how they will operate. There is a worked example on the next page.

Introduction

Don't think of the team player restrictions as indicating the player is "locked" to a team like in previous seasons; it merely reflects the team to which the player "belongs".

The new rules are to encourage a core group of players to play as a team within the league, whilst providing flexibility to draw on other club players when team numbers are down for a fixture. The HVA feel that players assigned to a specific team should make up more than half the players on the court, hence 4 players. There's a bit of flexibility added for libero players because their usage during a match cannot be determined from the scoresheet.

The Competitions Secretary will check for breaches of the rules when confirming the fixture result, by checking the scoresheet for starting players and substitutions. It is up to the team to make sure they do not breach the rules as a breach means they forfeit the match. Neither the opposition nor officials have any responsibility for checking for breaches before, during or after a match.

Player Registration

Every player can be assigned a team when added to the club roster, although clubs don't have to assign a player to a team at that time. However, when an unregistered player plays their first match for a team, they are added to the club roster and assigned to that team, and when a registered, but unassigned player plays their first match, they are also assigned to that team.

It is in the interest of the club to pre-register and assign players to a team in advance, so they are assigned to the team the club would normally expect them to play for, rather than the team they first play for. Pre-registering players also has the benefit that the player is then eligible to play in the KO Cup (if performed before the noted deadline), even if they haven't played before that deadline. As stated in the rules, you cannot change a team assignment once it is set without good reason.

Benefits

The new rules prevent the same group of players playing as two different teams between divisions.

As an individual player can play up/across/down as many times as required, there is no need for the club or HVA to monitor how many matches a player has played for each team. As individual players no longer get locked to a team after a certain number of matches, player availability does not diminish as the season progresses and clubs should not find it so difficult to get a team together, thus avoiding fixture changes or cancellations.

The HVA think the new rules should allow a team to operate with a slightly smaller squad than in previous seasons and we're hopeful this may encourage some clubs to enter additional league teams. The rules should enable a new/improving player to play up through the club more easily encouraging player progression.








The team want to substitute sub ⑧ for player ①.

F1. Old: These shall be neutral and qualified for all Division 1 matches.

F1 New: These shall be qualified for all Division 1 matches.

F5 Old: If time runs out before the completion of a match where no team is in default (i.e. the minimum two hours were available and the match started on time) both teams retain the sets already won and the away team is awarded the current set, plus any incomplete sets.

F5 New: If the match runs over scheduled court time, the referee should allow the match to finish as much as possible.

1. Based on information available to the referee, he/she should call time on the match when it can continue no more.
2. An incomplete match would be given to the team with the most sets won (as long as the match has started on time - if not the home team forfeits).

3. For this purpose, an incomplete set is counted as a win for the team with a lead of 2 or more points, otherwise a tie. If set scores are tied, the winner is the team with a 'points total' of at least two more than their opponent's.
4. If teams are still tied, then the two teams each get 1 league point.

C4. Clubs must specify their teams and players (including any NVL Super 8 / SVL Division 1 players - male or female) in those teams to the HVA before 30th September.

C7. Two teams in the same division, from the same club, will play as separate teams; each team submits a team of 6 named players. Any player not named, may play for the other team, up to a maximum of 2 separate occasions (i.e. the 3rd match played for either team, ties the player to that team). The details must be entered in the remarks section of the score sheet as „Match1“ or “Match2”.

C8. Only one player from the NVL Super 8/SVA National League Division 1 can be on the score sheet for any team in the HVA. All NVL Super 8/SVA Division 1 players have to be identified on the team sheet.

C9. Women may play for men's teams, in the league competition.

C11 Junior Players

C11.1 Any player, male or female, under the age of 16 on 1st September of the current season will be considered to be a “Junior” player.

C11.2 A “Junior” player registered with a club, may play in any of the club's teams, without the playing up or playing across rule being applied.

D3.e) Sending match information to the opposing team, in writing at least 21 days before the match date.

D4. The away team is responsible for confirming match information, in writing at least 14 days before the scheduled match date.

F1. These shall be neutral and qualified for all Division 1 matches.

F1.1 These shall be neutral and qualified where possible, for all other divisions.

F3. All clubs playing in Division 1 are required to provide two officials (1st & 2nd referee) for other clubs as set out in the fixtures list.

F3.1 For all other divisions two officials are required (1st and 2nd referees), although these can be members of the home club.

G1. League points will be awarded as follows:

- 1 point for playing the match +
- 1 point for every set won +
- 2 points for winning the match

Where a team loses a match as a result of a forfeit, no points will be awarded to the team.

G2. If two or more teams tie on league points, their position will be decided on:

- Most matches won then
- Least matches lost then
- Most sets for then
- Least sets against then
- The result of the matches played between the teams in the league.

I1. All rules A – H apply except that:

1.1. No male players, regardless of age, will be allowed to play in the Women's KO Cup competition

I8. Two teams from the same club in the Cup play as separate teams. These can be different to the teams registered in the league.

J11. Failure to send in team lists to Competitions Secretary by end September in current season.

C12. All players registered with a club are eligible to play in the Mixed Division.

C12.1 No playing up rules apply.

C12.2 Each team shall have a minimum of three (3) ladies on court at any time.

F3.2 The home team is required to provide a competent score for all matches.

I8.1 ALL players from each team must be registered for this purpose.

I1-1.2. No female player, regardless of age, will be allowed to play in the Men's KO Cup competition

F3 All clubs playing in Division 1 are required to provide two officials (1st & 2nd referee) for other clubs as set out in the fixtures list. For all other divisions the minimum number of officials is one (1st referee), and where possible two (1st and 2nd referees), although these can be members of the home club.

J1 £10 + 1 league points deducted

Added to C6 - The higher team must nominate 6 players. These players must play for the team before the end of January or another player should be nominated.

Old: Clubs with two teams in the same division will play as separate teams. If a senior team is designated, then players will be allowed to play up a maximum of two times. When this situation of playing up arises, it must be stated clearly on the score sheet. (This rule does not apply to the KO Cup Competition).

New: Two teams in the same division from the same club play as separate teams each team submits a list of players. Any player can play for the other team up to maximum of 2 separate occasions. The details must be entered in the remarks section of the score sheet as Match 1 or Match 2.

Two teams from the same club in the Cup play as separate teams. These can be different to the teams registered in the league.
